A BRIEF ON ICPC CHAIRMAN

r. Musa Adamu Aliyu, a seasoned legal expert and dedicated public servant, was appointed the head of Nigeria's principal anti-corruption agency, the Independent Corrupt Practices and Other Related Offences Commission (ICPC), on October 17, 2023 by President Bola Ahmed Tinubu, GCFR.

Dr. Aliyu is a Barrister and Solicitor of the Supreme Court of Nigeria, having attained the prestigious Senior Advocate of Nigeria (SAN) rank on October 12, 2023.

Prior to his appointment, Dr. Aliyu served as the Attorney General and Commissioner of Justice, Jigawa State (2019-2023), where he spearheaded transformative reforms in the justice sector. His tenure was distinguished by initiatives to promote the rights of women and children and the establishment of the Jigawa State Public Complaints and Anti-Corruption Commission, setting a benchmark for transparency and accountability in governance. In this role, he collaborated closely with the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) to enhance governance systems.

Dr. Aliyu's extensive career includes academic roles as a lecturer at the Jigawa State College of Islamic Legal Studies and the Faculty of Law, Nigeria Police Academy, Wudil, Kano State. He has authored publications featured in national and international journals and has participated in numerous conferences globally.

Guided by the principles encapsulated in the acronym "CARE"-Culture, Accountability, Responsibility, and Efficiency—Dr. Aliyu's policy thrust prioritizes proactive measures for corruption prevention without neglecting enforcement. His leadership emphasizes integrity, innovation, and the strategic use of technology to enhance ICPC's operations.



Dr. Aliyu's first year at the helm has elevated the Commission to unprecedented heights, positioning it as a beacon of honor and dignity. His adherence to the rule of law and international best practices has attracted respect, admiration, and strategic partnerships with key stakeholders across Nigeria.

Internationally, Dr. Aliyu is presently the Chairperson of the African Asset Recovery Practitioners' Forum (AARP-F), a position he assumed following his election by the interim council members. He also successfully led Nigeria to secure re-election into the Steering Committee of the Global Operational Network of Anti-Corruption Law Enforcement Authorities (GlobE Network), putting Nigeria on a global pedestal.

Under Dr. Aliyu's leadership, ICPC has garnered multiple awards and recognitions, both locally and internationally, for its exceptional contributions to the fight against corruption.

Born in Birnin-Kudu, Jigawa State, on December 27, 1977, Dr. Aliyu received his early education at Central Primary School Birnin-Kudu (1983–1989) and Government College Bauchi (1990-1995). He holds an LL.B from Bayero University, Kano (1998-2003), a BL from the Nigerian Law School (2003-2004), an LL.M from Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria (2006-2011), and a PhD in Law from Universiti Utara Malaysia (2016–2019).


